Dear Parents/Carers

Year 10 PSHCRE Day – Friday 06 July 2018

On Friday 06 July all Year 10 students will be taking part in a PSHCRE Day, entitled '**Being a Citizen in the UK**'. This forms part of the Personal Social Health Careers and Religious Education (PSHCRE) statutory requirements.

Every Year 10 student will be off timetable for the day and will have the opportunity to take part in a range of workshops from a number of organisations, including:

- **Rose Road** – The Rose Road Association aim to achieve 'a world where disability is not a barrier'. This session will focus on the role of the association within the local area and the importance of their work.
- **Animal Aid** – Animal Aid campaign against all forms of animal abuse. In this session students will learn about the history of Animal Aid, their aims, ethos and what they do now.
- **Help for Heroes** – Help for Heroes supports people with injuries and illnesses attributable to their service in the British Armed Forces. Students will investigate the courses and activities they offer to empower ex-service men and women to look beyond illness and injury, regain their purpose, reach their potential and have a positive impact on society.
- **Hearing Dogs** – Students will get the chance to learn about and understand deafness in our society and appreciate the impact a hearing dog can have on someone with a hearing impairment. They will also get the chance to meet one of the stars!
- **Rainbow Trust** – Rainbow Trust supports families who have a child aged 0-18 years with a life threatening or terminal illness. In this session students will learn what the trust does and why they are important in our area.
- **National Coastguard** – The National Coastwatch Institution (NCI) is an entirely voluntary organisation keeping a visual watch along UK shores. In this session students will learn about safety on the coasts.
- **Finance Education (delivered by The Hamble School staff)** – Launching the financial education programme. This qualification helps to instil the knowledge and confidence students require to make good financial decisions, as well as inspiring the next generation of finance and banking professionals.

Your child will be required to wear full school uniform and all daily arrangements, such as the beginning and end of the school day, will remain unchanged. Your child will be required to bring basic equipment with them such as pen, pencil, ruler and planner. They do not need to bring any other equipment, such as books.
