Year 11 History Revision Update

I am writing to update you on revision in History. From the start of the academic year intervention sessions have been available for all History students. These sessions have allowed students to make progress on identified areas of development. All students have attempted three mock examinations therefore all topics have been examined in year 11 through practice papers.

Students have been given a personal booklet for each of the three topics. These revision guides include content as well as exam questions and tasks. Over Easter we expect students to complete four key questions and specific details about these revision activities can be found on Show My Homework. In addition, we have put previous exam papers and extra resources on Show My Homework to consolidate learning.

Many students have asked how long they should be spending on History revision over Easter. The course is very content heavy (75% examination) and the quality of revision is more important than the time spent. However, as a guide, if students were in school, they would normally have 5 hours of lessons and 3 hours of homework over the next two weeks!

On Monday 10 April, in the afternoon, we will be running a revision session which students should already be aware of. After Easter students will receive new revision guides which are purely content based in order to 'top up' their knowledge. A schedule of the final revision lessons is attached, so that you know what your son/daughter will be covering in class. We will also continue our Thursday intervention sessions afterschool.
