


The Zoom links for your child's tutor group assembly will appear on Show My Homework next week under the Noticeboard section – this is accessed down the left-hand side of the page and when they click on this, they will be able to see all the relevant announcements and events for their class. When students click on a blue/red dot on the calendar, they will be able to access information – this is where we will put the Zoom assembly link.



This week we have been training our staff in using Zoom safely to protect our students and staff. We would, however, ask you to go through the following guidelines with your son/ daughter before they access their first live session:

1. Students will need to switch off their camera and microphone before joining. This protects their privacy and stops any background noise at your location

from disturbing the lesson. These can be turned back on later, if they need to ask a question.

2. Please ensure that students are appropriately dressed in case they accidentally turn the camera on.

3. The lesson might be recorded – this allows staff to play back the session e.g. for training purposes.

4. Students should let their teacher know if they have a question by using the 'thumbs up' tool on the tool bar. Students will need to wait to be asked to speak, as they would do in a normal lesson. They must speak clearly and use appropriate language at all times.

5. If students have a question, but do not have a microphone they can use the 'chat' feature and type their question.

Please follow the normal school rules of 'Ready, Respectful, Safe' for online lessons – the same as in a classroom. A parent/carer guide to using Zoom from National Online Safety has also been attached to this Newsletter.





Ideas of things to include in the letter:
