
NEW INTAKE – SEPTEMBER 2022


THE GREAT HAMBLE RED NOSE DAY BAKE OFF




YEAR 9 GEOGRAPHY A FLAG FOR ANTARCTICA



The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience and would like to thank Miss King for giving them a brilliant opportunity.




LEARN WITH US CAREERS DAY AT SOUTHAMPTON UNIVERSITY


