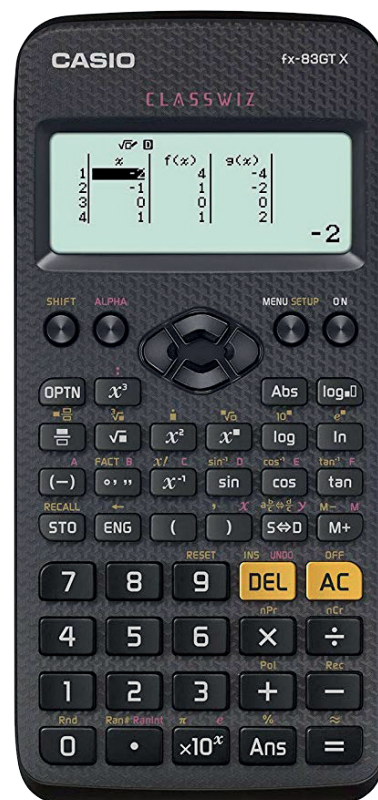
EQUIPMENT EXPECTATIONS

The results from events (both the morning and afternoon), were added together to give our final results:

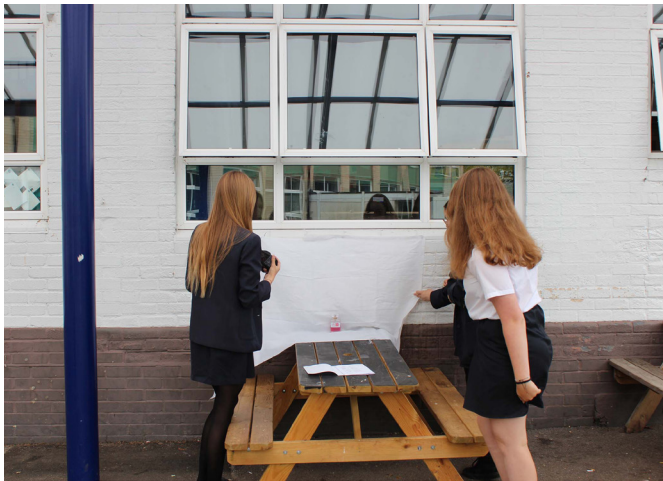

HC3S AWARDED LACA SECONDARY SCHOOL TEAM OF THE YEAR 2022



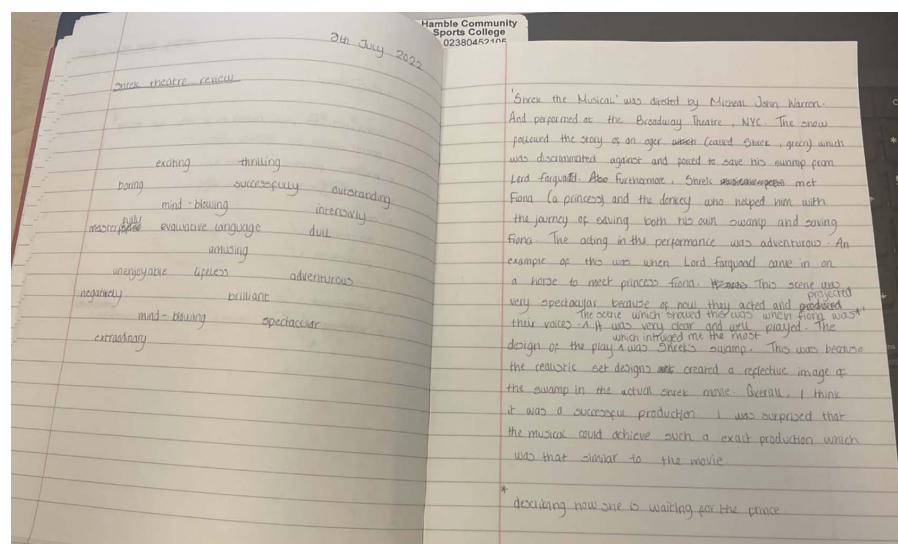
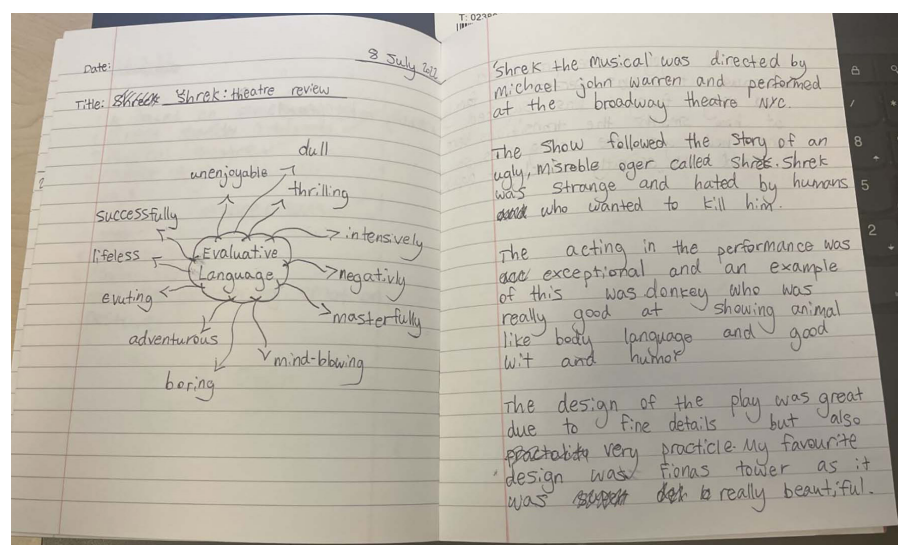
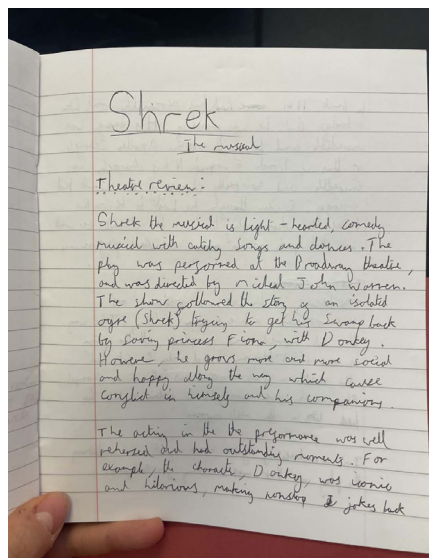
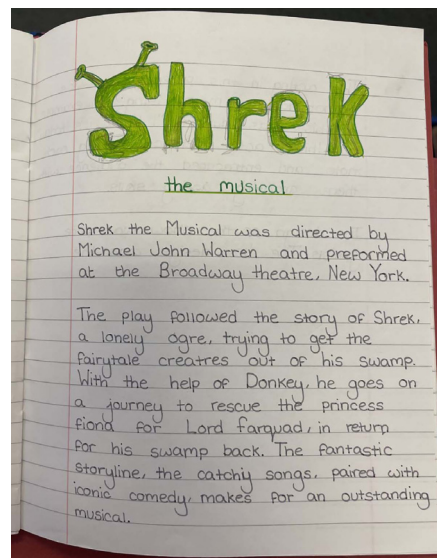

MARWELL ZOO

GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK

On Wednesday 29 June Year 7 headed to Marwell Zoo to complete Geography fieldwork linked to our topic on 'Ecosystems'. The first activity focused on exploring how different animals have adapted to their environments. This included finding out why a giraffe's tongue is 46-50cm long, why lemurs have forward-facing eyes and how animals like the snow leopard have adapted to live in cold climates.

Students then headed to the Tropical House where they visited an exhibition on climate change and energy. Here our students considered the evidence for climate change found in the natural environment, how energy demand is increasing and what Marwell Zoo is doing to become carbon neutral. They finally considered the actions people can take to reduce the impacts of climate change, through insulating our homes, planting trees and switching to renewable energy sources.

The students were also introduced to geographical fieldwork skills, by completing field sketches, an environmental quality survey and examining the social, economic and environmental impacts of the zoo on the local area.

We had a great day and the students were enthusiastic as they recounted the different animals they had met throughout the day.

In the final results they finished 106th out of 1100 boats, 5th in their class and 3rd in the 'Young Sailor' category.

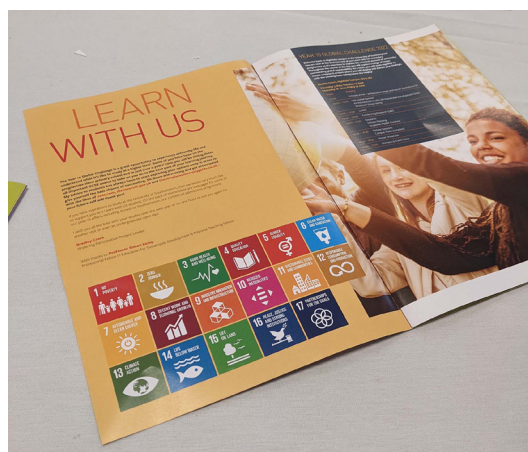

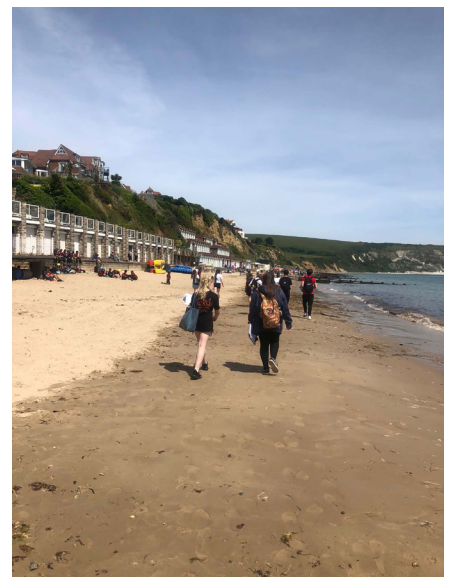
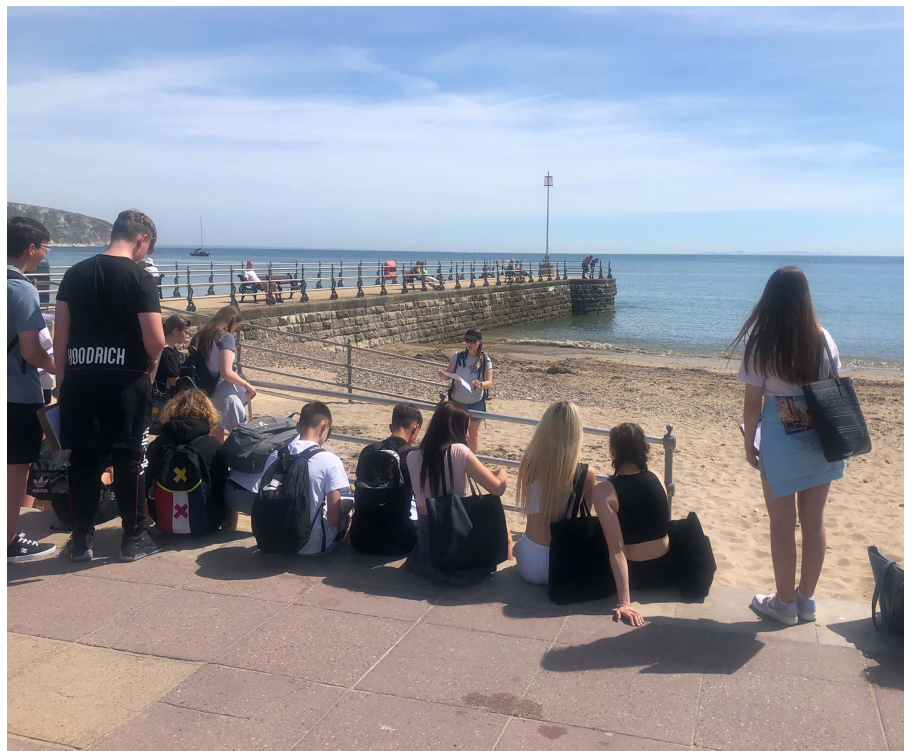
GCSE GEOGRAPHY

YEAR 7 & 8 ARTS DAY

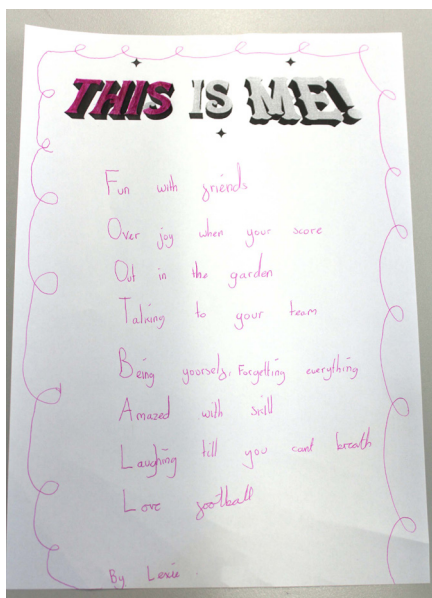


On Wednesday 13 July Year 7 and 8 took part in The Hamble School's very first 'Day to Create', in association with Artsmark.
