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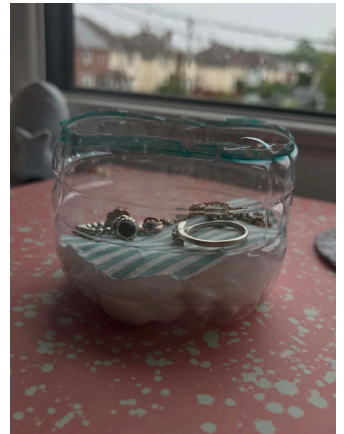


# YEAR 7 GEOGRAPHY

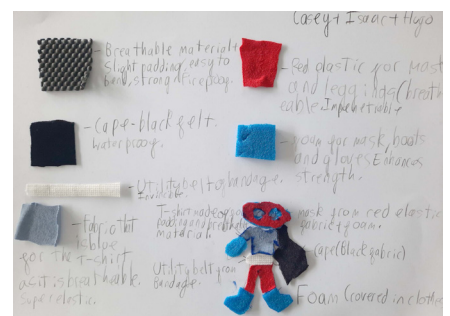
**Daisy A and Toni B (Year 7) both play for Hamble Falcons U12 Girls.**

In all subjects students also engaged in Jubilee-related curriculum activities.

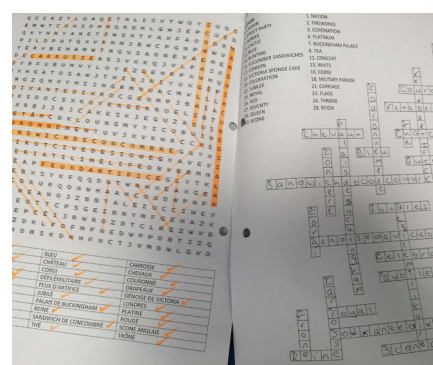
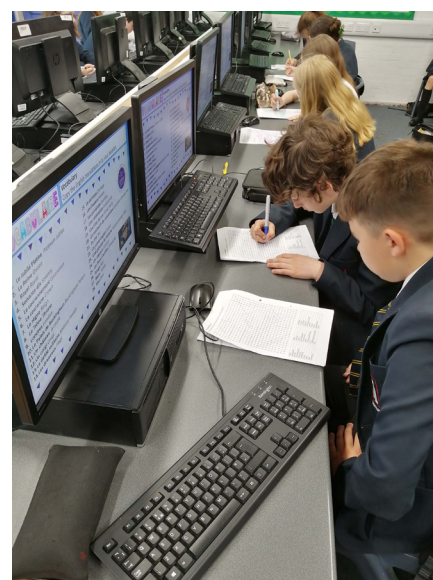


## LE JUBILÉ DE PLATINE/ EL JUBILEO DE PLATINO

# QUEEN'S JUBILEE CAKE

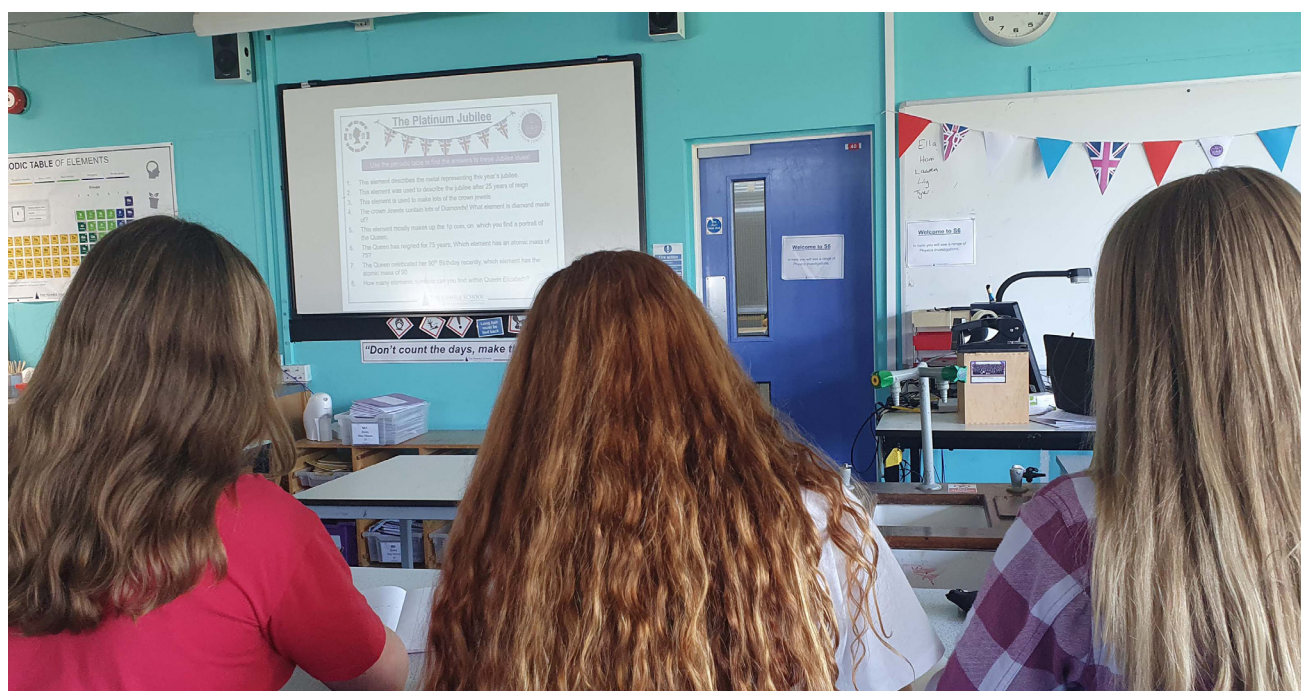
In Maths Year 8 students solved mathematical problems to find out who baked the Queen's Jubilee cake.

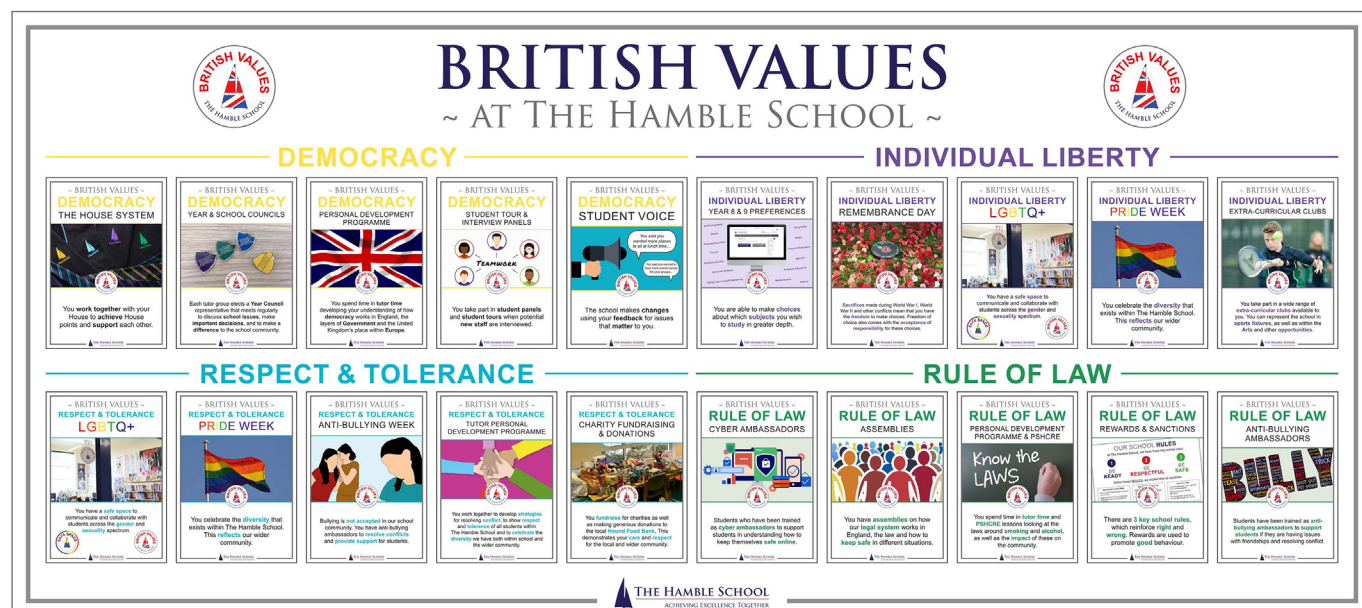
**DEMOCRACY** • **RULE OF LAW** • **RESPECT & TOLERANCE** • **INDIVIDUAL LIBERTY**
