Year 10 Media Studies

It is an exciting time in Media Studies as students embark on their NEA (non-exam assessment). As part of their brief, they need to either design a front cover and a double-page spread based on the topic of an 'animal welfare' magazine OR create a two-minute sequence to a love song.

In order to complete the NEA students, have to provide a minimum of five original photos (taken by them) for their magazine as well as an article for their double-page spread OR twominutes of footage for their music video.

Over the Summer Holidays students will need to take their five photos or record footage. They will also need to have some up with their own supporting ideas. These tasks need to be completed for their first Media Studies lesson in September. This will be set on Class Charts to remind students of their tasks. Students will have access to their OneDrive folder and can add any research material and planning to their PowerPoint.

Here are a few ideas to support your child with their photography:

- Photographs of pets
- Photographs of relative's pets
- Any visits to the zoo/farm

Here are a few ideas to support your child with their footage:

- A chosen 'love' song (it can be on any type of love as long as it's age appropriate)
- Filming location
- Choice of clothing, props, etc.
