



# YEAR 7 GEOGRAPHY 'OUR PLACE IN THE WORLD'

This week Year 7 have started their traffic enquiry as part of our Year 7 unit entitled 'Our Place in the World'. Students have been looking at Hamble and how and why it has changed over time.

They have compared old and new maps, as well as, photographic evidence and have suggested the problems in the local area. Traffic on Hamble Lane was quickly identified by students as a local area issue and each class has had the opportunity to investigate this in more detail. They have developed fieldwork skills by predicting the issues caused by traffic on Hamble Lane and collecting traffic data during one of their lessons.

It has been great to see the classes so engaged in the fieldwork and debating the issues facing our local area.





## YEAR 11 SCIENCE

In Science, Year 11 have completed their first round of Walking Talking Mocks.

These are designed so that students get a feel for what it is like to be in the hall sitting at exam desks but also so they can learn the best way to answer exam questions.

With the help of the science team and a nifty graphics pad we work on BURGing the question, annotating with useful information and then giving the answer a go. During this first round, students were brilliant – they were focused and sensible making the most of their time with the experts (that's us!).

We are really looking forward to tackling some skills questions in the coming fortnight.
