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YEAR 7

This year our Year 7 students have been working hard to develop skills in painting, drawing and sculpture. The work on display this evening is from their 'Colours in Nature' and 'Under the Sea' project.

As part of their 'Colours in Nature' project, students needed to use their colour theory knowledge to produce painted outcomes in response to the work of Wassily Kandinsky. This year, students have also looked at the work of Clare Youngs and Vincent Scarpace. We are particularly excited to show you their Scarpace inspired fish this evening.



YEAR 8



Throughout Year 8, students have built on their painting and drawing skills from Year 7 whilst studying the theme 'The Day of the Dead'. The watercolour painted skulls which are on display are just some of the painted outcomes produced by our Year 8 students. The students have also expanded their textural skills and their colour theory knowledge, studying artist Sonia Delaunay in the 'Texture Circles' project.



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YEAR 9



This year, our Year 9 students have spent their lessons building skills across several disciplines including printmaking, collage, mark making, working with pattern, photography and watercolour work. The work produced in the first term was in response to 'Food' and you will be able to see many successful outcomes from that project, using a variety of materials.

Students have been inspired by Andy Warhol, Lucy Clayton and Leon Zernitsky.

We are also very pleased with the outcomes produced by students in the 'Colour Photography' project. Students have investigated a range of photography and edited techniques, including macro, scanography and double exposure.



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YEAR 10 ART

Students have looked at a range of themes during this year, from Landscapes to Urban Jungle. The work on show this evening has taken inspiration from a number of artists including Farid Rueda, Torben Giehler and Shane McAdams. Students have experimented with a variety of materials and processes including shaving foam printing, monoprinting and collage.

We are also exhibiting highlights from student's current 'Natural Forms' project. They have been working towards a 3D vessel outcome, taking inspiration from the work of Peter Randall-Page, Dale Chihuly and Kate Malone.



YEAR 10 PHOTOGRAPHY

Students start the course by learning the basics of photography, including camera functions, lighting and compositional rules, followed by a masterclass in Photoshop skills. The work on show this evening has taken inspiration from a number of photographers including Jelle Martens, Reynald Drouhin and Stephen Gill. Students have experimented with both digital and physical manipulation techniques including scanography, collage and painting.



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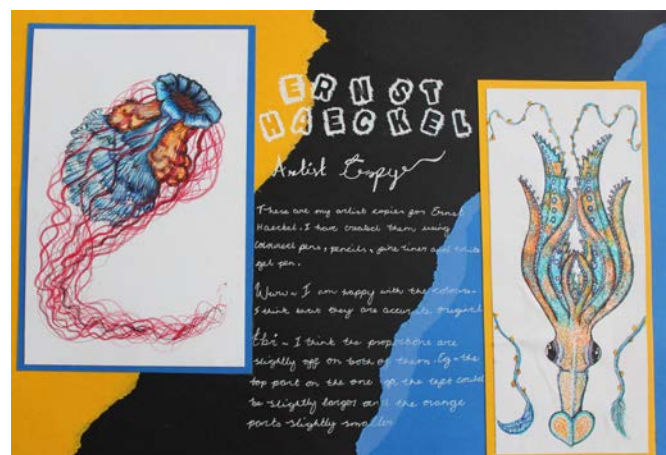
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YEAR 11

BTEC ART AND DESIGN

Over the course of Key Stage 4, our BTEC students have responded to briefs linking to prop and costume design as well as contextual research into contemporary and historical art. The students have produced a wide range of pieces which are both 2D and 3D.

In tonight's exhibition you will see work from a range of projects, including our most recent project in which students used contextual research to inform their designs for a new video game sequel. Students chose to respond to existing games such as Pac-Man, The Legend of Zelda and Angry Birds.



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YEAR 11

GCSE ART AND DESIGN

We are exhibiting work from all Year 11 GCSE Art students this evening. The work featured is taken from their coursework units: Freedom, The New Normal and Force, as well as their exam unit theme of 'Lock'. Students investigated with a range of materials in all of these projects including screenprinting, digital editing, collage, stitching and polyprinting as well as an extensive range of drawing techniques. They have taken inspiration from a variety of artists and designers including Michael Craig Martin, Jasper Johns, Annegret Soltau and David Carson, amongst many, many others.

GCSE PHOTOGRAPHY

We are exhibiting work from all Year 11 GCSE Photography students this evening. The work featured is taken from their coursework units: Freedom and Creative Landscape, as well as some work created in response to a range of different exam topics. Students investigated a range of materials in all of these projects including digital drawing, collage, drawing, sewing, and double exposure. Students have taken inspiration from a variety of photographers and artists including Thomas Lamadeui, Anastasia Savinova, Slinkachu and many others.

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Arts Week

We were very excited this year to be a part of a Creative Arts Week. Students across Years 7-10 were given the opportunity to participate in a diverse range of workshops and trips, from samba to manga drawing, dance workshops to theatre tours.

The work you see on display this evening is from our 'Drawing with Light' workshop where students experimented with the photography technique 'long exposure' to create these exciting outcomes.

There is also a sneak preview of our collaborative artwork where students produced their own zentangle 'component' as part of a larger installation piece inspired by Kelsey Montague.

This year, students from The Hamble school have had the opportunity to participate in two external photography competitions. Many students entered The Young Photographer's Competition with the theme 'The Beauty of Architecture' and the Rotary Interschool Photography Competition with the theme 'Movement'.
