Next Academic Year

As we look ahead to the start of the next academic year, I would like to share some key information with you that will ensure that the start of term establishes a positive foundation for the year ahead. All students will return to school at 08:30am on Monday 4 September – We will be starting the timetable on Week 2. On this day they will receive their new timetables, spend time with their Tutors and then start lessons.

Behaviour

At The Hamble School we expect students to 'Be Ready, Be Respectful and Be Safe'. We would ask that before September you remind your son/ daughter of the school rules, so that we can all have a successful start to the new academic year. School Uniform and Equipment

Thank you to all families who have continued to support us in ensuring that students attend school in the correct uniform and with the equipment that they need each day to be successful in their lessons. We would ask that all families refer to the uniform and shoe guidance on our website <u>https://www.thehambleschool.co.uk/uniform/</u>, which outlines our expectations and ensure that students are in the full correct uniform for the return to school in September.

I would like to draw your attention to a few key points which we will be focusing on in the new academic year. All students will be issued with a planner in September and they are expected to bring this to school every day. Shoes must be formal, leather-style and plain black. Skirts must be knee length and not rolled up. All students require a school bag which is large enough for A4 books/ folders and a pencil case so that they are fully equipped and ready to learn each day. Students will need to return to school in blazers. Jewellery is not allowed to be worn in school, with the exception of one small pair of stud earrings worn in the lobe of each ear, a wrist watch or medical alert. Jewellery will be confiscated if it is seen. Hair must be of a natural colour, in a style suitable for school – no extreme hairstyles.

Attendance

Attendance has the greatest impact on achievement. Your child must be in school everyday and ensure they attend all lessons on time. If your child is absent through illness please report this on the Class Charts App or email <u>attendance@thehambleschool.co.uk</u> I must remind you that holidays should not be taken in term time.

Tutor Groups

At The Hamble School we take great pride in the high standard of pastoral care that we provide for our students. The tutor is the first point of contact for parents/ carers and an important person to support your child. Whilst we try to ensure that the same person stays with students between Year 7 and 10, sometimes we have to make changes to tutors. I have outlined the new tutors for September below:

- 9-1 Mrs Wilmott/ Mrs Webb will become 10-1 Mrs Wilmott/ Mrs Cooper
- 9-4 Mrs Holden/ Mrs Stratford will become 10-4 Mrs Holden/ Miss Kerry
- 9-6 Mr Vine will become 10-6 Mr Vine but will be joined by Mr Wells, who will also be working with the tutor group as Mr Vine will take up the role of Assistant Progress Leader for Year 10.

A reminder that we have already written home with the new Year 11 tutors for September 2023 as these students will now be in intervention groups.
