And the Stars were Burning Brightly




Boys Don't Cry


We are all Made of Molecules


All of the Above **Juno Dawson**


George **Alex Gino**


Cinderella is Dead **Kalynn Bayron**


Release **Patrick Ness**


As I Descended **Robin Talley**


The Weight of a Thousand Feathers **Brian Conaghan**


Adaptation **Malinda Lo**




Tell it to the Moon




Heartbreak Boys **Simon James Green**


I'll Give you the Sun **Jandy Nelson**


Carry On **Rainbow Rowell**


Unspeakable **Abbie Rushton**

The Art of Being Normal



On the first day at his new school Leo Denton has one goal – to be invisible. Attracting the attention of the most beautiful girl in year eleven is





Boy Meets Hamster




The Upside of Unrequited


Melt my Heart


Two Boys Kissing


Nick and Charlie **Alice Oseman**


All the Bad Apples **Moira Fowley-Doyle**

Been Here All Along **Sandy Hall**






They Both Die at the End

Two teenage boys find solace in each other when they are informed that they have been selected to die in a day's time.


Isolated and scared, the boys reach out to each other, and what follows is a day of living life to the full. Though neither of them had expected that this would involve falling in love...



Things a Bright Girl Can Do




The Truth About Keeping Secrets **Savannah Brown**




The Quiet at the End of the World **Lauren James**


You Only Live Once **Jess Vallance**


What if it's us **Becky Albertalli and Adam Silvera**

known as Leopard.




Oranges are Not the Only Fruit **Jeanette Winterson**


The Secrets of Billie Bright **Susie Day**

All the Invisible Things **Orlagh Collins**



The Deepest Breath **Meg Grehan**



There's a girl at school that she likes more. A lot more. Actually, she's a bit confused about how much she likes her.




Last Bus to Everland **Sophie Cameron**


The Hand, the Eye & the Heart **Zoë Marriott**


The Black Flamingo **Dean Atta**
